Last summer, at our first District Cabinet meeting, I shared my dream with the cabinet officers and chairs. It was for every club to return to our roots and focus their time, energy and talents on community service for one day.


Clubs everywhere across the District do great community service projects, but I believe sometimes the impact we make gets lost in the shuffle. But by conducting service projects all at the same time—a wave of Lions, Lioness and Leos all making their communities better across Central Ontario could occur. At that Cabinet meeting, I asked the District Officers to follow the dream with me and on the Day of Service visit and lend support and encouragement to each club and it's members. They all agreed—and the dream began to inch closer to becoming a reality. We then approached the clubs and asked them to come onboard and develop service activities they could do on the Day of Service. All we asked was that the focus of the day be on helping people and making our communities stronger, and not to fundraise. I've always considered myself as a bit of



realist—so my expectation was that perhaps 15 clubs might take up the challenge and participate. However, I grossly underestimated the passion our clubs have, and as time went on, the dream began to take hold. When April 26th finally arrived, 44 clubs across A-12 had committed to following their own dreams in their communities. Marjorie and I started our travels in Alliston at 8 am at their free pancake breakfast and road cleanup and finished up in Powassan at 7 pm with the Sundridge Lions who were visiting with local Sundridge seniors in two retirement homes. In between, 50 service projects, and thousands of people were helped. Environmental projects, barbecues, food drives and so much more. And as you will see in the pictures in this newsletter, great things can happen when we work together.

The Day of Service and the work you did was being followed by Lions and Lion leaders around the world, and there is discussion about expanding it next year beyond our A-12 borders, and have it become Ontario-wide, Canada-wide or perhaps in every country that we serve in. Never have I been so proud to be an A-12 Lion as I was that day.

Thank you to all of you for turning a dream into reality. You have made a difference!
