A Lions club is an international non-sectarian, nonpolitical service organization whose members are a group of service-minded men and women from all walks of life. Men and women who are dedicated to working and raising funds to make their communities a better place to live in. These funds help to support their work with the handicapped, the underprivileged, the aged, the sickly, the blind, the deaf and the youth of the community.

Who can become a Lion?

Any male or female of legal majority, good moral character and good reputation in his/her community, regardless of color, race, religion, language or political beliefs is welcome to join. At this time there are almost one-and-a half million members in over 43,000 clubs in over 200 Nations worldwide who meet regularly to enjoy the fellowship, develop leadership qualities and spend part of their free time helping those less fortunate the world over !

Why become a Lion?

The main reason is to help others. With the help of all the members of the club, we can work and raise funds to allow Lions to offer assistance where needed in the community.

Significant funding is also raised through Lion work parties at special public events. Past examples of these being the National Capital Air Show, public winter events, ploughing matches and at local and international rugby matches.

Where and when do Lions meet?

The Barrhaven Lions Club holds its regular meetings on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month. At the first meeting Lions meet to dine together, listen to a guest speaker and enjoy comradeship. At the second business meeting they monitor the actions of the Board of Directors, approve or decline any major undertakings of the executive.

Meetings are held at the Heritage School at the corner of Strandherd and Jockvale in Nepean. The Board of Directors of the Club meet once a month and all members are welcome to attend. The Annual Dues are approximately \$80.00, plus a one-time only new member fee.
