

Club Within a Club

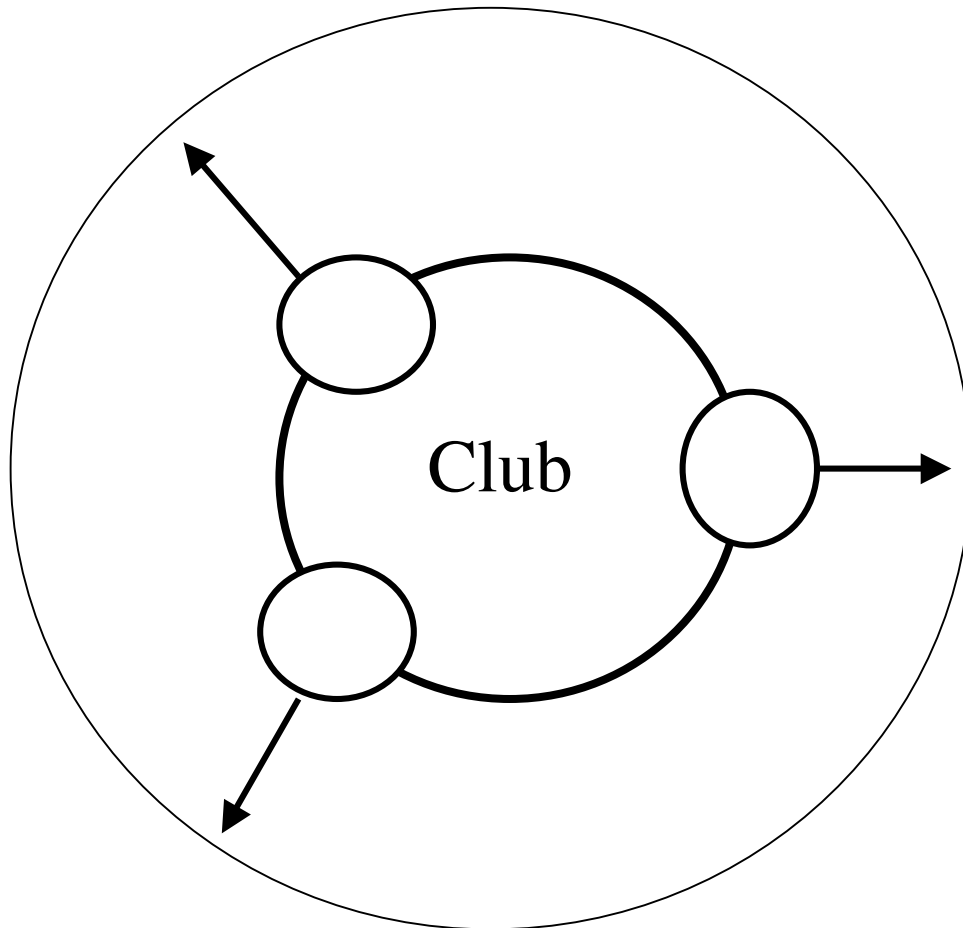
Spark Enthusiasm Among Younger Club Members

Concept: Forming a **Club Within a Club** allows a small group of new, younger club members to pursue their own service activities and fundraising projects. This helps build their enthusiasm for Lions and increase their involvement, as well as presenting a new recruiting opportunity for your club.

Steps to Success:

- 1) **Form the Group:** Encourage three or four new, younger members to form a group and develop new service activities and fundraising projects. The guide “Making it Happen,” available from the New Clubs and Marketing Department at International Headquarters, is an excellent tool to help with community needs assessment and project development. - 2) **Choose a Chairman:** This new group will operate like a committee. Select a chairman to give monthly progress reports during club meetings and to lead the group to their fundraising and service activity goals.
- 3) **Recruit Additional Members:** Encourage the group to invite their interested peers to become part of the club. One approach is to initially ask non-Lions to only participate in the project, hoping to pique their interest in becoming a full-fledged club member.
- 4) **Form More Groups as Needed:** As additional younger people become involved with the club, more “clubs within the club” can be formed. This will allow small groups of members to develop ownership and pride in the projects they pursue.
- 5) **Form New Lions Clubs:** As more groups are formed, they can be made into a standing committee of the club, or “spun off” into a club of their own. Community minded adults that are age 35 and under can form a New Century Lions Club.
